

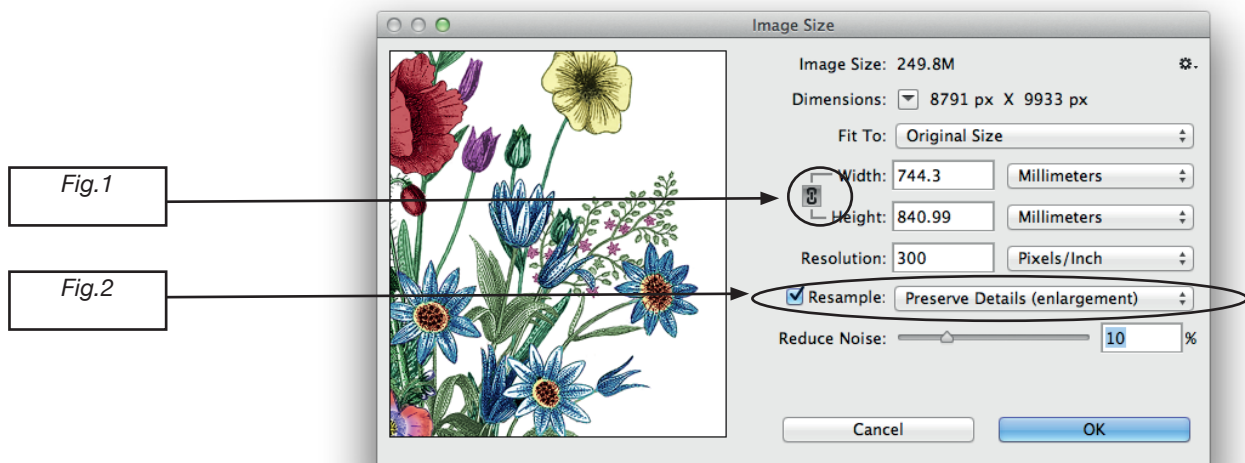
Enlarging images in Photoshop CC is best done with images of 300dpi or up.

Enlarge an image in Photoshop CC :

- 1 Open your image >File >Open
- 2 Go to the Image Size menu; >Image >Image Size
Make sure the image is 300 pixels per Inch (Resolution in dpi - Dots per Inch)

If you need to change the resolution, do the following;

- 3 In the Image Size menu, Untick 'Resample'
- 4 Change the Resolution to 300 dpi
(After changing the resolution, Retick 'Resample')



- 5 For enlarging, adjust either the Width or Height to the required size. The 'linked' symbol (*See Fig.1*) for Width and Height should be active, in order to keep the proportions of the image locked.
- 6 'Resample' should be ticked whilst enlarging, Choose 'Preserve Details (enlargement)' from the drop-down box. (*See Fig.2*)
Reduce Noise when necessary. Check the preview for the result.
Press 'OK'

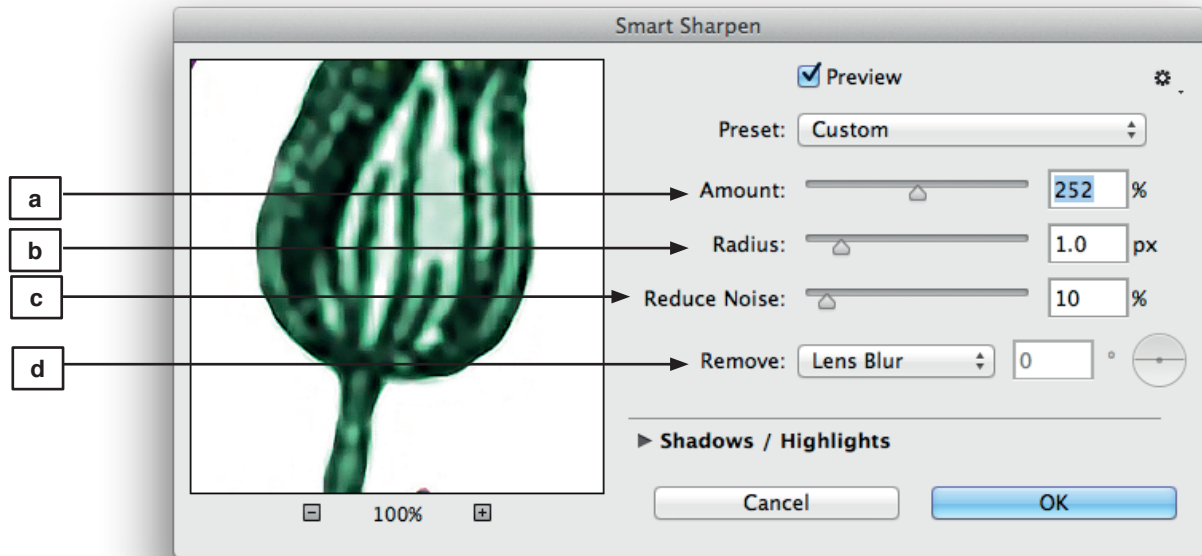




Smart Sharpen works best if used after first enlarging an image in the 'Image Size' menu.

Using Smart sharpen in Photoshop CC :

Choose >Filter >Sharpen >Smart Sharpen



- a Amount :** Strength of Sharpening applied
- b Radius:** Width of sharpening effect in pix
- c Noise:** Amount of Noise reduction
- d Remove:** (Type of Blur) Usually Lens Blur
Keep 'Preview' ticked to see an updated view of your image

When finished, press 'OK' to confirm.
The image is now ready to save.
